Students are expected to present the outcome of the course as an open session in front of an audience under the supervision of the instructor.

This course aims at introducing the students to the aesthetic musical theories and constructivist forms in addition to types of sound effects and their role in a theatre performance; through listening, analysis and differentiation. The instructor guides the students to read a play in one act, decide on the kind of music and sound effects used and create the script required for that.

Course Description

This course aims at introducing the student to the concept of scenography, its historical progress, elements and types according to artistic trends, its role in designing and composing the image visually with all its components; set, lighting, costume, accessories, makeup and blocking be in in a theatrical scene or television or cinematic. It also looks at the experiences of prominent scenographers who directed simultaneously with their visual design. The students are expected to present a scenographic design for a dramatic scene.
